SUBJECT: Designation of the Secretary of the Army as the Army Action Agent for Training, Certification, and Physical Fitness Standards for DoD Civilian Police Officer and Security Guards

1. Reference the Secretary of the Army memorandum dated 8 MAY 06 SAB and the Deputy Secretary of Defense memorandum dated 4 JAN 06 SAB. Pursuant to Title 10 U.S.C. 113 and consistent with DoD Directive 5101.1, para 4.3, this serves to appoint the Army Provost Marshal General, as the DoD Executive Agent for Training, Certification, and Physical Fitness Standards for Civilian Police Officers and Security Guards in the Department of Defense.
2. As the Army Action Agent for Training, Certification, and Physical Fitness Standards for Civilian Police Officers and Security Guards, the Provost Marshal General will be responsible for promulgating standards and monitoring Service and Agency compliance. This responsibility, consisting only of administrative resources will be carried out within existing Army resources.
3. The Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness retains their responsibilities to function in an oversight capacity and will monitor this program accordingly. Additionally, the Army Administrative Officer will incorporate this designation into the Executive Agent Records/System.

SUBJECT: Delegation of Authority for Exercise of Responsibilities as the DoD
Executive Agent for Training, Certification, and Physical Fitness Standards for DoD
Civilian Police Officers and Security Guards

1. Reference Deputy Secretary of Defense memorandum, dated January 4, 2006, subject: Designation of the Secretary of the Army as the DoD Executive Agent for Training, Certification, and Physical Fitness Standards for DoD Civilian Police Officers and Security Guards. Pursuant to Title 10 U.S.C. 113 and consistent with DoD Directive 5101.1, I hereby designate the Secretary of the Army as the DoD Executive Agent for Training, Certification, and Physical Fitness Standards for Civilian Police Officers and Security Guards in the Department of Defense. As the DoD Executive Agent for Training, Certification, and Physical Fitness Standards for Civilian Police Officers and Security Guards, the Secretary of the Army will be responsible for promulgating the standards and monitoring Service and Agency compliance. This responsibility will be carried out within existing Army resources.

The Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness will oversee this DoD Executive Agent assignment.

The Director, Administration and Management, will incorporate this Executive Agent designation into the DoD Directive System. This supersedes the then-Deputy Secretary of Defense Wolfowitz's memorandum on "Training, Certification, and Physical Fitness Standards for Civilian Police Officers and Security Guards in the Department of Defense," dated September 16, 2003.

SUBJECT: Designation of the Secretary of the Army as the DoD Executive Agent for Training, Certification, and Physical Fitness Standards for DoD Civilian Police Officers and Security Guards

- I recommend the subject designation.
- Minimum training standards for DoD Civilian Police (GS083) and Security Guards (GS085) have been established and agreed to by all agencies participating in the DoD training standards working group. Establishment of physical fitness standards are in progress.
- With the establishment of the minimum training standards, the time is appropriate to designate a DoD Executive Agent to implement the standards.
- The Army is best positioned to assume this Executive Agency assignment, and the Army concurs with the assignment.
- This Executive Agent designation will provide the Secretary of the Army the authority to implement the department-wide standards, to monitor, and report on Service and Agency compliance. Resource implications associated with this DoD Executive Agent assignment are small, consisting only of administrative resources, and will be funded from within existing Army resources.
- Policy oversight for this Executive Agent assignment will be provided by the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, per the Deputy Secretary of Defense memorandum, September 16, 2003, at Tab B.

SUBJECT: Executive Agent for Training, Certification, and Physical Fitness Standards
for Civilian Police Officers and Security Guards in the Department of
Defense

Under the policy lead of the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, a training standards working group has established minimum training tasks for Civilian Police Officers and Security Guards in the Department of Defense. Work on Physical Fitness Standards is in progress. The Army's Office of the Provost Marshall and the U.S. Army Military Police School have been an integral part of this effort.

With the establishment of minimum training standards, the time is appropriate to designate an executive agent to implement these standards. Pursuant the Deputy Secretary of Defense's memorandum of September 16, 2003, the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness will designate the Secretary of the Army as the DoD Executive Agent for Training, Certification, and Physical Fitness Standards for Civilian Police Officers and Security Guards in the Department.
