MEMORANDUM FOR ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF THE ARMY (ACQUISITION,
LOGISTICS AND TECHNOLOGY)

SUBJECT: Delegation of Authority to Act as the Department of Defense (DoD)
Executive Agent (EA) for Military Ground-Based Counter Radio-Controlled Improvised
Explosive Device Electronic Warfare (CREW) Technology

1. References:

a. Department of Defense (DoD) Directive 5101.1 (DoD Executive Agent),
September 3, 2002, Incorporating Change 1, May 9, 2003, Certified Current as of
November 21, 2003.

b. Memorandum, Deputy Secretary of Defense, Dec 1, 2013, subject: Designation
of the Secretary of the Army as the Department of Defense Executive Agent for Military
Ground-Based Counter Radio-Controlled Improvised Explosive Device Electronic
Warfare (CREW) Technology.


2. Reference 1a authorizes the DoD EA to delegate, to a subordinate designee within
that official's Component, the authority to act on that official's behalf for any or all of the
DoD EA's responsibilities, functions and authorities assigned by the Secretary of
Defense or Deputy Secretary of Defense. In December 2013, the Deputy Secretary of
Defense designated the Secretary of the Army as the DoD EA for CREW technology
(reference 1b).

3. In accordance with reference 1a, I hereby delegate this authority and assign
responsibility for the DoD EA duties to the Assistant Secretary of the Army (Acquisition,
Logistics and Technology) with the authority to further delegate at the General Officer or
Senior Executive Service level. If you choose to redelegate this authority, you may
further restrict or condition the delegate's exercise of the authority. A delegation will not
be effective unless it is in writing with the official designated by organizational title,
signed by you and a review by the Office of the Army General Counsel has determined
that it is not legally objectionable. No redelegation will take effect until a record copy of
the memorandum is provided to the Office of the Administrative Assistant for archiving.
You will remain cognizant of and accountable for any and all actions taken pursuant to
this delegation or any redelegation thereof.

4. In cases where your proposed decision represents a change in policy, or is of
Congressional interest, or is of interest or concern to me, you will brief me before
making the decision unless the exigencies of the situation prevent the briefing.

5. This delegation is effective immediately and expires 3 years from the date of this memorandum, unless earlier suspended, revoked or superseded.
